### Why are EEO supporting Make Way Day?

EEO will be supporting Make Way Day co-founded by The Disability Federation of Ireland on the 26th of September 2018 from 10.30-1pm. Make Way Day originated last year following public meetings with Dublin City's then Lord Mayor and people with disabilities. EEO will co-ordinate a walk of Tullamore town centre and will identify obstacles on paths such as parked cars, bicycles, plant pots, sandwich boards and will place a sticker on these obstacles.

### Our ask of you as a local business?

- To be mindful of people with mobility issues by ensuring that sandwich boards adhere to the licencing agreement and that there is 1.5 metres between the footpath and the sandwich board.
- To ensure that equipment belonging to your business is not obstructing the pathways and preventing those with mobility issues from moving around our towns freely.
- Support the campaign by uploading your company details (logos/pictures) and outline how your business supports those with disabilities to move freely and safely throughout Tullamore Town.
